Psalm 42:5 (TPT) – So then, my soul, why would you be depressed? Why would you sink into despair? Just keep hoping and waiting on God, your Savior. For no matter what, I will sing with praise, for living before his face is my saving grace!

Day 1 – **Read**: Hebrews 7:18–25 **Ponder in Prayer**: Record the things in this passage that give you HOPE.

Day 2 - Read: 2 Chronicles 20:1-30

Ponder in Prayer: "We do not know what to do, but we are looking to you for help." Today, look to the Lord for help, tell him your specific need, and wait in hope and faith.

Day 3 - Read: James 6:7-11; Ps 27:13-14

Ponder in Prayer: Wait on the Lord – wait well... Consider what it means to 'wait well', and determine to live that way today.

Day 4 - Read: Isaiah 49

Ponder in Prayer: As you read this chapter, consider God's great and everlasting love, make note of how personal and intentional his love is, and thank him for choosing to love you. Consider the phrase, "at just the right time", and determine again today to wait patiently in hope for God to move in your circumstances "at just the right time".

Day 5 - Read: Joshua 1:1-9

Ponder in Prayer: The promises of the Old Covenant are extended and sealed with the New Covenant. Our part in the covenant remains the same, except that Jesus intervenes to do what we cannot. This promise to Joshua of God's presence extends to us; make note of God's instructions to him, our role in this covenant, and obey in confident hope today.
